met in a REGULAR VIRTUAL MEETING recorded on You Tube, at which time the following items were discussed, considered, passed or adopted, to-wit:

Judge Sylvia, according to law, opened Court at 9:38 a.m. into Open Session. Commissioner Tice offered prayer. Judge Sylvia led in the Pledge of Allegiance to the American flag and to the Pledge of Allegiance to the Texas flag.

At this time, the Court turned to citizens' comments. Judge Sylvia read a comment by Matthew Faulkner. Mr. Faulkner recommended opening County-run trash collection sites up to trailers over 10 feet long two days a week.

The court proceeded with Agenda Item 1.1, discuss and consider Public Health Department and Emergency Management. Mary Beth Bess, Chambers County Health Services Director, informed the Court that there are 87 active COVID-19 cases in the County. She said 21 percent of county residents are fully vaccinated. Bess and Public Health Emergency Preparedness Coordinator Kevin Crump touched on the \$4,925,250.00 COVID-19 Vaccination Capacity Grant between the Department of State Health Services and Chambers County Health Department.

Accepting the grant was on the Consent Agenda as Item 19.18. This item was pulled from the Consent Agenda to be considered immediately.

Comments by County Clerk Heather Hawthorne and attorney Robert Bass with Allison, Bass & Magee, LLP.

The Court then turned to Agenda Item 7.2, discuss and consider 2021 Certificates of Obligation projects.

Code, V.T.C.S.; Deliberation regarding security devices or security audits. The Court returned to Open Session at 2:07 p.m. with Judge Sylvia presiding.
